



The Community Policing Team (CPT) model will be rolled-out across Wiltshire Police this autumn, starting with the county of Wiltshire on 17 October 2016 and followed by Swindon on 7 November 2016. This follows a successful trial of the new model in Trowbridge, Warminster, Bradford on Avon, Westbury, Tisbury and Mere.

CPT combines Neighbourhood Policing, Response teams and Local Crime Investigators so there is a “one team” approach to community policing. It means there is a bigger team of officers and police staff available to attend incidents and improves communication between teams and departments. It gives the public a better service because issues can potentially be resolved at the first point of contact (101 and 999 call-takers) and provides them with a named officer/police staff member who they will be able to keep in touch with during the investigation. It also encourages officers and staff to take more “ownership” of cases.

There will be seven Community Policing Teams: Swindon North, Swindon West, Swindon South, Wiltshire North, Wiltshire West, Wiltshire East and Wiltshire South (your local team is Wiltshire South). Each Community Policing Team will be overseen by a Superintendent and will have an Inspector and a Deputy. The team will be made up of a mix of police officers, community co-ordinators, PCSOs, civilian local crime investigators and Specials.

We will be engaging with the public as the roll-out commences and will welcome feedback about the new model. Report for Alderbury Parish Council

Current Priorities

-Local Police officers and PCSO's are carrying out daytime and early evening patrols of rural car parks and parking areas in response to a recent increase in 'Beauty Spot' Thefts from vehicles.

Thieves are smashing windows of parked cars (usually parked by owners whilst out walking/ dog walking) and stealing items left in cars. Recent hotspots include Bentley Woods (Farley/ Winterslow) and car parks of rural village halls where visitors have parked cars whilst attending events.

Local CPT officers have issued the below crime prevention advice

- Don't leave any valuables on display including laptops, satnavs, mobile phones, handbags, credit cards or vehicle documents in your car. If it is unavoidable – place them in the boot and ensure that any electrical equipment is switched off.
- Don't leave coats/jackets on show in the vehicle as a thief will want to see if there is anything valuable in the pockets.
- Clean satnav suction marks off your windscreen, as leaving them is an immediate advert to thieves that a satnav is in the vehicle. Make sure no satnav attachments are left visible in your vehicle.
- Remove your stereo if you can, mark it with the vehicle registration number if you can't.
- Leave your glove box open to show there is nothing in it.
- If you own a van, make sure you remove your tools overnight and display an appropriate sign in the rear window making this clear.

Anyone who sees suspicious activity should contact police on 101, if a crime is in progress ring 999 and if possible record the registration number of any vehicle involved.

-Local officers carrying out targeted patrols of Alderbury Village Hall/ Social club to target suspected drug taking amongst young people gathering at night

Recent Local Crimes

Other than a few domestic related assaults (which we can't detail for obvious reasons) there have been no reported crimes in Alderbury since a Theft from a vehicle in Clarendon Road was reported to us on 25th September.
