Firstly, thank you for considering our application for funding. I just wanted to take a moment to add some additional information to the funding application.

As I am sure you are aware in April 2024 we opened our wonderful new preschool building, and whilst this was a community funded building, the preschool incurred a huge cost for opening the building. As a charity we anticipated additional costs, so in the 2 years prior to the building being delivered we were able to fund raise just short of £15,000 to support the anticipated spend. As with all moves, this budget was not enough and we ended incurring costs of close to £28,000, once you had taken into account the additional wages, safety assessments, insurance, fencing alongside the resources as we had to kit out the centralised areas, supply the kitchen and create a new baby room.

At the end of the 23/24 school year, you will see that our finances were struggling as a result of this spend and I wanted to just give you some confidence that while we were closing each month at the end of that year, with less then £2000, we have now recovered that position and have closed with over £10,000 the past few months and anticipate this will continue to rise as we go through the school year.

Our initial fundraising focused solely on the internals of the preschool, as we felt we needed to 'live in' the garden to see how it would work with increasing from two to three rooms.

We are now in a position to adapt the new space we have, this includes resurfacing the grass area, as it is so water logged its not useable in the winter, replacing some well loved garden equipment like our climbing frame, creating a new vegetable garden and planting area, alongside a water/mud/sand space and eventually our secret garden which will be a sensory space to come and seek the calm and explore nature.

We have lots of plans to make our new gardens, into the best they can be to encourage our children to explore and love nature, whilst also making our existing space more practical to allow for 50+ sets of wellies to be on it daily throughout the wet spells,

Hopefully this helps paint a picture of what we are trying to achieve over the next few years. This is alongside the removal of the old building and then we will begin to plan and adapt that space too
