Your environmental group appears to have been very successful with the two lengths of hedge planting. The yellow rattle area not quite so. The oak tree rejuvenation appears to be hugely successful. My wife and I have never seen the foliage looking so healthy and dense.

We would be pleased to know what other plans, if any, are intended for the area. Perhaps returning it to a more overall wildlife area with general bluebell and daffodil planting and just the path through ? Save mowing costs ?

Also can you tell us if the red ash tree in the area and close to our house and our neighbour's, Mr Searle, is on your pollarding list, since it has grown rapidly,

It would be good If it could be done as successfully as the adjacent oak tree.

Incidentally, further to a previous question we raised, our neighbour and former parish councillor, Mr Searle, is adamant that he was instrumental in adding a clause to the purchase of the area by the parish council from the bankrupt developer that the area should not be built on for eighty years although you cannot trace this.
