Alderbury Parish Council is the most local level of UK government serving the parish of Alderbury in Wiltshire. It consists of 11 elected councillors serving around 1300 households.

The parish council levies a tax (precept) to pay for its local services. In 2021/22 the parish precept is 51,990. The precept covers the costs of running the council and providing all of its services including grass cutting, litter removal, grounds maintenance, play grounds, burial grounds, bus shelters, footpaths and much more.

The Council is committed to listening to and working with local people and many local residents work with us as volunteers, helping to keep Alderbury and Whaddon the special place we all love.

COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Wildlife Friendly Alderbury - 17 May 2021 – onwards Working with Wiltshire Wildlife Trust to protect and enhance the biodiversity of the Village (draft project plan now available). Phase 1 commissioned – orchard and wildflower meadow at Waleran Close.

Village Hall Refurbishment - 1 April 2021 – 18 May 2021 The £400k refurbishment and extension of the Village Hall in Rectory Road was completed in May and the official opening took place in August.

Road Safety and Speeding - 1 May 2021 – 30 June 2021 The new speed indicator device was installed in June.

Recreation Ground Storage Building - July 2021 The old garage building was refurbished in August.
